

Rifles, pistols seized in gun raid MORE than 20 illegal guns were allegedly found on the northern beaches in a raid by federal agents and police. Australian Border Force officers and detectives from the N SW Police Force's Drug and Firearms Squad allegedly seized the firearms on Thursday 2nd August 2018 at a house in Frenchs Forest. The raid came after ABF officers at Sydney's main international mail exchange allegedly identified consignments of firearm parts being imported Without a permit. Officers allegedly found twenty one unregistered rifles, four unregistered prohibited firearms, including an old

SKK rifle and a crudely



manufactured rifle and an unregistered air pistol. They also

NOTICE TO ALL MEMBERS.

It is important to remember that to shoot on any range you must be in possession of your shooter's licence and must produce it on request to a range officer or club official before being permitted to shoot. When you visit the range and intend to shoot, you must have your licence and be able to produce it, you will NOT be able to shoot without it. Do not put the PFA range staff in the awkward position of having to decline your shoot. Keep your licence with you at all times when you are in possession of your guns and intend to shoot. Don't blame the PFA range staff for your mistake, don't ask them to overlook the law, even if they know you, they are not allowed to ignore the law. Shooting on a range without a licence in your possession is against the law and penalties apply, it also puts the range licence in jeopardy and could cause restrictions to be imposed on the range and its operation. Carry your licence, produce it when asked for it and enjoy your shoot with all your mates. Editor DBT.
