COVID-RELIEF INFORMATION FOR FIREARMS LICENCE HOLDERS. (March 2022, FAR Website.)

Due to the ongoing health situation in NSW, the NSW Firearms Registry advises the following: With the latest COVID-19 health advice to stay home, Service NSW strongly advises you to use their website or call 13 77 88, rather than visit a service centre. Visit their COVID-19 page for information and advice on the assistance available for NSW residents and businesses. Please consider this advice when considering attending a Service NSW centre to have your photo taken for your licence.

Club Participation

The Firearms Registry is aware that due to the ongoing pandemic and evolving circumstances, some licence holders may find it difficult to comply with their participation requirements given stay-at-home orders, self-isolation, quarantine or even due to a reluctance to congregate.

Any club member, whether a sports target (pistol or longarm), hunting or collecting, needing to undertake participation activities do not have to do so while clubs and ranges are closed due to the health situation in NSW.

To support this:

The Firearms Registry does not propose to revoke a licence on the basis that a licence holder cannot fulfil their participation requirements due to self-isolation, lockdown, quarantine, concerns about congregating due to COVID or club/range closure due to the health situation in NSW.

Licence holders in this situation do not need to notify the Firearms Registry on this matter.

Expiry of photographic advice letters

Under the current health orders, it is a reasonable excuse for a NSW resident to leave the house in order to fulfil a legal obligation. The taking of a photo for a licence card is fulfilling a legal obligation and Service NSW centres remain open and accessible for you to do this. However, if you cannot complete this before your photographic advice letter expires, please contact the Firearms Registry to seek an extension. Please ensure you do this before the expiration of the letter.

Expiry of permits to acquire

Under the current health orders, it is a reasonable excuse for a NSW resident to leave the house to obtain goods. Most firearms dealers across NSW remain open. However, if you cannot attend a firearms dealer before your permit to acquire expires please contact the Firearms Registry to seek an extension.

Firearms Registry - business as usual

The Firearms Registry continues to operate as business as usual and is providing our whole suite of services to the NSW firearms and weapons community. To help us continue to do this, please be considerate of our need to support all our customers and limit your email and telephone queries to urgent matters only.

Thales Australia kicks off 2022 expanding Advanced Manufacturing in Lithgow.

Thales Australia has received Development Approval and have commenced construction (February 2022) on the first phase of an ambitious industrial plan to transform its Lithgow Arms facility in regional New South Wales. The new development will deliver an advanced manufacturing and integration hub for the precision manufacture of next generation Australian designed weapon systems, integrating both traditional precision manufacturing and digital technologies, including 3D printing, and the installation of automated electro-plating and other metal treatment capabilities.



The new development will also include a new purpose built live firing test and evaluation capability to support systems qualification and integration, and the acceleration of research and technology development of digitized small-arms and weapon system platforms. Late last year, Thales Australia announced over \$12 million of investments in new infrastructure and advanced manufacturing capability at the company's Lithgow and Mulwala facilities, supporting the Governments' sovereign munitions and small arms research, design, development and manufacture priority. The new development at Lithgow will expand the world-leading precision-manufacturing capability of Lithgow Arms to support new sovereign manufacturing partnerships for strategic ADF programs, including the company's partnership with Rheinmetall Defence

Australia to manufacture key components for Rheinmetall in support of the Australian Defence Force Land 400 program.

The purpose-built facility will also support collaboration across research institutions, SME partners, and key Industrial partners to create the soldier systems and small arms





of the future, as well as train the next generation of skilled advanced manufacturing workers in the central west. (example of Rheinmetall products shown above)

The Committee of Management

I recently read an interesting review in the February 2022 issue of **Australian Shooter** the author of the original article was Rod Pascoe (thanks to Rod P for his time, efforts and expertise) and it made for a great very interesting read. I have edited it to fit in with our other articles and to to introduce a new brand of ammo for you to discover, maybe test and try for yourself. The subject is **AGUILA** and while not well known in Australia they claim to be one of the world's largest producers of rimfire ammunition and have been manufacturing product since 1961.

Aguila is manufactured by **INDUSTRIAS TECNOS** in Cuernavaca, Mexico and in 2011 they partnered with industrial giant **TEXAS ARMAMENT &**

TECHNOLOGY (TXAT) as exclusive US and International distributor of their products. Aguila is Spanish for eagle, hence the brand's logo. In 2016 Aguila launched its first US branding and marketing campaign and, with TXAT began production

at a second manufacturing plant in Texas.

Aguila has now made it to Australia and is offering a wide range of 20+ rimfire cartridges for target shooting

and hunting as well as a range of 'special products'.

Aguila is represented in Australia by Melbourne-based

RAYTRADE and apart from the rimfire range,

Raytrade will be releasing centrefire handgun, rifle and shotshell ammunition later this year.

The subjects of the article are three of Aguila's .22 Long Rifle (LR) target specialists rounds.



Rifle Match, Pistol Match and Target Competition

Advertising material states 'Aguila Prime technology is engineered and tested to Olympic shooting standards' and up until about 2016 the boxes were marked Eley Prime, the change is likely to be due to ditching the Eley priming formulation for one of its own. Each example has a brass case topped with a 40gn solid lead round-nose projectile. There are no marks that would identify the three types apart. Rifle Match and Target Competition rounds each have

an advertised muzzle velocity of 1080fps and Pistol Match 925fps, with all three described as 'standard velocity'. The ammo test was done using a pistol, revolver, lever action and bolt action rifles. Rifles fired from a rest at 50m and the handguns at 25m.

To summarise: The Pistol Competition ammo worked best in the pistol and revolver 34mm, followed by Rifle 52mm then Target 56mm, group sizes when fired from a Hammerli Model 208.

In a CZ 452 rifle topped with a scope and fired from a rest at 50m a group of 15mm was the best outcome using the Rifle Match product, 18mm with Pistol Match and 20mm with Target Competition.

In a Marlin 39A lever-action with open sights a group of 51mm was achieved with the Rifle Match ammo (including one unfortunate flyer) and 60mm with both the Pistol and Target products. (*I have not included the*

results of the Anschutz rifle as the test day was extremely windy and not suitable, however the test target is shown to the right which was shot in very blustery conditions.(DBT ED)) All ammo functioned faultlessly in every firearm and most



importantly all rounds fed, fired, extracted and ejected without a hitch in the self-loading pistol and lever-action rifle.

In Summary: Pricing is expected to be between \$12 and \$15 for a 50 pack (less in bulk) and as a general rule most .22LR ammunition pricing is proportional to its quality or, more to the point, its quality control.

The Aguila samples used in this review fit a price range and quality scale and would be ideal and economical for most rifle and pistol club applications.

In these tests the Pistol Match did perform better in the pistol and revolver, with all three rifles preferring the Rifle Match. The Target Competition didn't feel outstanding in any of the firearms but as suggested it shouldn't be dismissed from your own/personal load development routine. Sometimes the label doesn't necessarily match the type of firearm for which it's best suited and often ammunition labelled 'pistol' can perform exceptionally well in a rifle and vice-versa.
