ON THE ST IVES PISTOL CLUB RANGE THE FOLLOWING IS MANDATORY:-

HEARING PROTECTION EYE PROTECTION ENCLOSED FOOTWEAR

Failure to enforce the above can lead to cancellation of the range approval. Therefore, it is the responsibility of all to ensure the above conditions are met. This is not negotiable. These requirements will also apply on our own range.

You are also required, by law to be in possession of your shooters licence and show it before you are permitted to shoot. It is also best practice to have your membership card and produce it at the sign in desk when booking in.

ROs required for PFA.

Not too many changes/differences are anticipated when we move across to our own range, however we will need, must have some new/additional range staff. Step up now and join the ROs that are already contributing to the club, add to your enjoyment, be a part and take a share and enjoy yourself at the same time. Who doesn't want to be part of the team and help out? The ROs will need to become familiar with the new computerised system and training sessions will take place once we are in the new building. Those who are not computer literate can be part of some crash courses that will be arranged. Make a contribution, join the team.

DPI Game Licencing announce that Bondi State Forest is now available to book for hunting.

It's in the Southern region and is a Category 1 forest, open to hunting 7 days per week across 16,000 hectares that allows up to 57 hunters at any time. You may hunt using all methods (firearms, bows, dogs) and the forest allows night time hunting of pigs using dogs. The closest major centre is Bombala, about 35 km north. of the forest, where you'll find food, fuel and emergency services. If you need petrol after 5.30 pm, the closest alternative source is Cann River (85 km south) or Cooma (90 km north-west).

Access Bondi State Forest via the Bondi Forest Way if travelling from the east, or via the Monaro Highway or Buldah Road (off Mila Road) on the western side. Main roads through the forest are well maintained and suitable for 2WD access in clear weather. Some smaller tracks are only suitable for 4WDs though. In winter, snow is common on the higher areas and all hunters should take care. Bondi is mostly pine plantation interspersed with native hardwood areas. There are many creeks and watercourses and grassy flat areas suitable for camping. The Genoa River runs through the north and eastern sides and you'll find a spectacular swimming hole at Rockton Falls. Bondi is a great deer hunting forest with fallow deer concentrated in the west and reds and sambar in the east. There are also high numbers of feral pigs and wild dogs in the forest as well as rabbits and foxes in the central and western areas. Login to online licence holder services to book your Written Permission to hunt Bondi State Forest.

A wild boar on Sunday 3rd December 2017 attacked and fatally wounded a German hunter as the man tried to shoot him, police said on Monday. The 50 years old man was out with several other hunters near the north-eastern town of Greifswald 120 miles (190 km) north of Berlin, when he was killed by the male boar. Witnesses to the attack said the man fired a shot and then moved into some reeds to look for the animal, where the pig apparently surprised him. A spokesman for the German Hunting Association in Berlin said it was important never to look for animals that had been shot on one's own and noted that wild boar numbers were on the increase.



About 500,000 wild boars are killed every year in Germany, but experts say that is not enough to keep the population from growing. (incredible, ED) Aggressive wild boars in the northern state of Schleswig -Holstein hit the headlines in October when they rampaged through the town of Heide. Four people were injured by the animals.
